COURSE DESCRIPTION:

With the passage of Senate Bill 5 (SB5) and Senate Bill 365 (SB365), the 77th & 78th Texas Legislature established statewide residential and commercial energy conservation codes, including the 2000 International Residential Code (IRC) - with the 2001 supplement - and the 2000 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) - with the 2001 supplement.

This seminar provides a broad overview to Texas builders, city building officials, community development corporations, architects, engineers, inspectors and design professionals with the basic information they need to enforce or comply with the commercial energy provisions of the 2006 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC). Emphasis is on understanding the purpose and scope of the energy requirements and basic knowledge required to enforce the IECC or prepare for an International Code Council (ICC) exam for certification as an IECC Commercial Energy Plans Examiner or IECC Commercial Energy Inspector.
